Going Beyond in this issue of Lifeline -Tim Burow

"So as to preach the gospel even to the regions beyond you, and not to boast in what has been accomplished in the sphere of another." (2 Corinthians 10:16 NASB)

More than a sharing with Buzz Lightyear's purpose-filled catchphrase, "To infinity and beyond!" He wants to always push the boundaries and accomplish still more. In the midst of Paul's defense of his apostleship to the Corinthian church, he reminded them that they were the fruit of his preaching, but not they alone. If they lifted up their eyes and considered, they would find that he accomplished more than a sharing with them only. His work and faithful service to Christ took him to regions beyond.

For more than six decades we have been engaged in the kingdom work of training God's people to share His precious message with a lost and dying world. One of the many challenges we have undertaken is to see 10,000 preachers trained on the African continent in the next decade. After all, training is what we do. However, ministry

training meets only half the need. In order to continue in their ministries long-term, these preachers must have a vocation to support themselves and their families. For them, our efforts must go beyond the spiritual. They need an employable skill.

For more than eighteen months our Global Relief Ministry has been involved in providing food, clothing, medicine, clean drinking water, and temporary shelter to thousands of refugees in and outside of Ukraine due to the war with Russia. We give thanks for God's generous people who have allowed us to do these things, but that is not all we are doing. Our efforts in the refugees' regard must go beyond meeting their physical needs to meeting their psychological and especially their spiritual needs. The fruit of this is seen in the many baptisms and growing churches. Ultimately their souls are the most important thing to us.

In our Capstone Trip to Israel our graduates are able to go beyond classroom instruction to actually walk in the footsteps of Jesus in some key historical and archeological sites. They return changed and better equipped to bring the good news to life and edify the Lord's people.

At our Graduate School's Sermon Symposium our students journey beyond their usual instructors to hear from guest lecturers and even have the opportunity to present important ministry research. And preachers and Bible teachers join them to be inspired to move beyond their current abilities as they teach and exhort the Lord's body.

Through SALT (Sunset Academy of Leadership Training) we are aiding churches and their leaders to envision a future beyond the status quo and move forward with a purpose in mind for God's redeemed people.

All of this is possible because of the God who is able to do beyond anything we can ask or imagine (Ephesians 3:20). At SIBI we are praying and working so as not to be short-sighted and ineffective in the things that God has given us to do. Our plans and our vision are not too much for the God whose power was demonstrated in raising His Son from the dead, and it is our hope that your faith is in Him to use you mightily and one day receive you into the great beyond. May you be blessed and encouraged as you read this edition of Lifeline.

10,000 VOICES TO CARRY GOD'S WORD TO AFRICA

Tor the past few years SIBI has been engaged in an initiative called 10,000 Voices in an effort to increase the number of preachers in Africa. The focus of this project, in which SIBI partners with World Bible School and Healing Hands International, is both to recruit more preachers and to equip preachers with vocational skills. The largest hurdle to having more preachers is a lack of financial support. Though Africans are very generous, small rural churches do not have the means to fully support a preacher. A major part of 10,000 Voices is to provide vocational training to preachers to promote longevity in their ministry.

Esoh Aaron leads 10,000 Voices in Africa by working with churches and equipping schools with vocational training opportunities. He recently sent an update to share the progress in the work of training new preachers as well as new, creative opportunities for vocational training. Even as these men are training, they are already actively sharing the gospel and baptizing new souls into Christ.

September ended with great excitement and thanks to God Almighty through Jesus Christ, for He added eight souls in Buea, Cameroon. These came because of God's work through the evangelistic outreach of the students into the community. Buea College of Biblical Studies also started a satellite campus in the neighboring Republic of Chad, a predominantly Muslim country with very few Christians. The result of the outreach of the school and the faculty shows how important and productive the time and effort spent can be. Brother Aaron is working in conjunction with SIBI and the Sunset Church of Christ to create a model program that can serve as the next step in preacher training in Africa. Vocational training is not a new concept for many of our partner schools in Africa, but what brother Aaron is working to accomplish is to share information and resources so the students are given the best

opportunities possible.

Each school provides different vocational training opportunities for the students to be equipped with skills by which they can support themselves. Students learn skills for agriculture, technology, or tailoring. In Buea, students are learning about electrical installation. They are taught the basics of electrical work and can wire a bungalow upon completion of their training. One school in Nigeria has been given different types of sewing machines, both electric and manual, so students can supplement their income through tailoring. Another school in Apata Ibadan, Nigeria, has chickens that they are learning to breed as both layers for eggs and broilers for meat. This not only provides training for the students, it also provides income for the school. The vocational school at the Shepherd Village in Ghana is progressing with fish farming, and the fingerlings are doing well. Special holding ponds with nets were comstructed to help protect the growing fish from predators. The school in Ghana also teaches basic cell phone repair and has become the authorized Vodafone repair center in their region.



It is exciting to see the rate of growth and development of training schools in West Africa. SIBI is grateful for our partners for 10,000 Voices— Healing Hands International and World Bible School. Healing Hands has already helped to provide clean drinking water for the school in Buea, and World Bible School has developed SIBI courses for their app to help recruit and train more students for these schools.

As Esoh Aaron closed his report, he gave praise to God:

"We thank God for the new vocational training schools in West and Central Africa, and the Lord adding of ten souls in His vineyard during the month. Thank you, Sunset Church of Christ for the great work the Lord is using to carry out in Cameroon, Africa and the world at large. We give glory to God for you brethren, for your support to help us train those working in the vineyard of the Lord. We are thankful to God Almighty for the sacrifice you make as partners in the work of the Lord in this part of the world, particularly West/ Central Africa."

Providing Beyond the Physical Needs

n 2022 SIBI's Global Relief Ministry started building a long-term strategy to provide humanitarian aid and kingdom expansion in Ukraine and to Ukrainians in European countries.

In Ukraine a network of 36 distribution centers was developed that included 18 churches and 18 humanitarian operations like hospitals, refugee centers, and centers for social orphan children. By partnering with two aid delivery and teams, distribution Poznavki church and Volunteer Brothers, SIBI has been able to deliver enough food and humanitarian aid to feed over 7,000 people a day across Ukraine. This level of aid distribution has continued throughout 2023.

Over the course of this year there have been some notable trends. Churches that have become local aid distribution points have formed a cooperative network and spirit of fellowship. Additional churches are joining the network, and the number of churches has increased from 18 to 24 from July to October. The amount of aid delivered across Ukraine has increased 20% to meet the needs left by other groups who ran out of aid. One of the participating churches has stated, "This program gave life to our church."

Throughout the year, donations to SIBI's GRM were able to meet ongoing needs. There was a strong response to the Kherson dam disaster. The delivery teams delivered over 400 gallons of water a day to people in the Kherson area and provided other forms of aid such as fuel, boats, food, and megaphones. Donations also helped fund the drilling of a water well in the Kherson area on the property of the church. Food and other humanitarian aid were delivered to the military on the front line. Also, another container of Breedlove soup mix arrived in Ukraine during September, providing another 907,200 meals.

Beyond the Physical Needs

In addition to this aid distribution network in Ukraine, which provides enough food for over 7,000 people a day, SIBI's Global Relief Ministry is helping Ukrainian refugees in European countries. In 2022 SIBI began outreach efforts to Ukrainian refugees in European countries by establishing operations in Poland (Warsaw, Sopot, and Elblag), in the Netherlands (The Hague area), and with partners in Athens, Greece, and Zagreb, Croatia. SIBI has provided food and other types of humanitarian aid and has established a program called "Soul-Aid" to help Ukrainians overcome the trauma of the war.

May–June

Warsaw, Poland: Yura, graduate of Ukrainian Bible Institute (UBI), and Julia Turan organize outreach efforts for refugees in Warsaw, and 85 to 100 refugees attend the Wednesday weekly meetings. In these meetings food is provided, a Biblical lesson presented, and time is given for discussion with tea and cookies. Because of the strong response, they added a weekly Bible study and formed a youth group of Ukrainian children. Refugees were invited to the Sunday worship with the church, and a number of baptisms have added many souls to the church in Warsaw. They continue to receive spiritual food and fellowship along with the physical aid they were initially seeking.


Sopot, Poland: The Sopot Church of Christ, through the efforts led by Molly and Annabelle Dawidaw, developed an effort to help many Ukrainian Christian refugees who made their way to Sopot. Sopot was one of the first places where SIBI provided funds to assist in this significant effort to provide food and other kinds of daily living needs. Molly and Annabelle also facilitate the purchase of food in Poland, which is then shipped to be distributed in Ukraine. They also assist



refugees by providing Polish language lessons to Ukrainian children. GRM is so blessed to have partners like Molly and Annabelle in helping refugees.

Elblag, Poland: Bogdan (Graduate of UBI) and Olga Bogasarova lead the humanitarian aid and church planting effort in Elblag. As they help people by providing food and aid, they build relationships that help bring people to faith. In just five weeks, the size of the newly planted church grew to fill every part of the building, even the outside area.

"Soul-Aid" Trauma Relief Seminars

To help Ukrainian refugees heal from the trauma caused by the war, SIBI's Global Relief Ministry developed the "Soul-Aid" program. As a part of this program, this past spring and summer we partnered with Thereasa Winnett from Teach One Reach One Ministries. GRM provided funding for travel and lodging expenses, translators' stipends, and a local facility. Thereasa Winnett presented a seminar to the parents and grandparents on how to help children who have experienced the trauma of war. While Thereasa presented to the adults, her team members ministered to the children. The seminars were three to four days. Additionally, Thereasa provided copies of her book in Ukrainian to attendees, which was very popular. SIBI was glad to pay for the translation, printing, and delivery of 4,000 copies of the book for these refugee families. The seminars helped the refugees and outreach leaders in each location. The first seminars in the spring helped so much that SIBI provided additional seminars in the summer. The trauma seminars were presented in four locations during April: The Hague and Rotterdam areas, Netherlands; Zagreb, Croatia; Warsaw, Poland; and Sopot, Poland.



Summer

Richard and Denise Baggett, SIBI's Global Relief Ministry coordinators for the Ukraine funds, visited each of the locations of Ukrainian refugee outreach efforts and participated in a joint outreach to Ukrainian refugees in Athens, Greece. During the trip they observed outreach efforts, participated in church planting activities in Elblag, Poland, and attended the second round of "Soul-Aid" trauma relief seminars presented by Thereasa Winnett in Warsaw, Sopot, Elblag, and The Hague. The seminar was also presented in Athens, Greece.

After the war started in Ukraine, many Ukrainians fled to Greece, particularly Athens. There is now a large population of Ukrainian refugees in the Athens area. Dino Roussos and the Glyfada congregation held a Mediterranean Christian

Conference during June. SIBI's Global Relief Ministry agreed to sponsor 50 Ukrainian refugees to come to the conference, 30 adults and 20 children. Out of the 30 Ukrainian adults who attended, there were six baptisms. Following the conference, Richard and Denise met with leaders of the Glyfada congregation to discuss plans for follow-up and expanded outreach to Ukrainian refugees in the area.

Camps for Refugee Children

Warsaw, Poland: The Baggetts connected Terry Kile, Director of BEYM (By Example Youth Missions), with Yura Turan from Warsaw. Terry and Yura developed a plan to hold a summer camp for Ukrainian refugee children in Poland. A team of Christians came from the United States and conducted a camp for the refugees. Eighty children and 40 adults from Warsaw, Sopot, and Elblag attended. It was very well received. The parents of the children pleaded, "Would you please do this again?" The impact of the camp is already helping the local





outreach and has opened many new doors.

The Hague, Netherlands: Alexander (Sasha) and Anastasia (Nastia) Nikolaienko (both graduates of UBI) lead outreach efforts to Ukrainian refugees in The Hague, Netherlands. They hold regular meetings and events to reach teenagers and are making contacts with refugees at refugee centers in the area. They hosted the "Soul-Aid" seminars and in August held a camp independently from the BEYM camp in Warsaw. The camp was two weeks in length, a week for older teens and a week for younger children. Thirty-two teens came the first week, and 30 younger children came the second week. There was a variety of activities and games mixed with devotionals, Bible lessons, and relationship building. The teens and children wanted to know when they could do it again. The parents, especially the mothers, also wanted their children to have this camp experience again. Having the camps was a good way to meet and interact with the parents.

Since the beginning of the war in Ukraine, donors have generously supported the humanitarian and outreach efforts to Ukrainian refugees, both in Ukraine and across Europe. SIBI is committed to empowering churches to meet the needs of these refugees and is thankful to so many churches and individuals who have not stopped contributing to this ongoing need. 

EUROPEAN VISION WORKSHOP

The European Vision Workshop is an annual event held during the first week of October. It takes place in various locations throughout central Europe in order to be easily accessible for attendees. The workshop is hosted jointly by Sunset International Bible Institute, Partners in Progress, World English Institute, and Healing Hands International. It is used as an opportunity to offer spiritual encouragement to our many European church leaders facing unique challenges and experiencing life-changing victories as they minister to congregations spread throughout Europe. The workshop consists of diverse speakers, discussion groups, devotionals, singing, food, and fellowship. All of these things combined offer a rich experience for all who attend.

The 2023 European Vision Workshop took place in Shëngjin, Lezhë, Albania. We had approximately 90 people in attendance representing 19 different countries. The focus of this year's event came from Hebrews 10:24-25:

"And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

We spent two full days listening to encouraging messages from various speakers, enjoying wonderful singing, and fellowshipping with one another during our break times and meals. Our keynote speaker was Bruce McLarty, who currently serves as the Minister in Residence at Freed Hardeman University. His words were inspiring and brought about a sense of renewal to our spiritual energy.

The ability to network with fellow servants of God is powerful, and we often hear how beneficial it is for people to have this opportunity during the workshop. Our time together allows for cultural and language differences to be set aside so we can truly see that we all share a common faith and devotion to Christ. We discuss with one another the struggles of our ministry work while also celebrating the many successes. The relationships developed through this camaraderie extend

far beyond our time together at the workshop and provide a constant source of encouragement. What a blessing it is to have brothers and sisters in Christ around the world.

92nd Graduating Class of Suns

The commencement ceremony of the 92nd graduating class from our resident school occurred on May 20, 2023. This is our 62nd year of operation since the school began in 1962. Each year for over half a century, men and women have walked across the stage to begin a life of fruitful ministry in the Lord's kingdom.

Twenty-five men and women graduated from the various departments at SIBI. Twelve earned the Bachelor of Theology Degree or the Bachelor of Biblical Studies Degree in residence here in Lubbock. Some completed their studies in December 2022; others finished in May. Seven earned their degrees through online courses. Six are receiving their Master of Biblical Studies Degree, having completed 36 hours of advanced education in our Graduate School. Some received their diplomas in person, but others, scattered across the USA and around the world, received theirs in the mail. Beyond all of these, there are hundreds who are graduating this year from our 81 international partner schools. Most of their names could not be listed, but you will find a representative list in this program.

Joining thousands of other graduates of various disciplines at SIBI, these go forth well equipped for the great task of preaching the whole gospel to the whole world, wholly to please God.

Our prayers for strength, our hope for the future, and our dream for the evangelization of the world accompany these graduates as they begin a new phase of their ministry lives.







Virtual Live Classroom: For students who want an in-class experience and have the ability to go to school full-time, the Virtual Live Classroom option is available. These students must apply through the Residential Studies department and will follow the school calendar with the students in Lubbock.

CARA SPEER



SUNSET ACADEMY OF LEADERSHIP TRAINING

The Sunset Academy of Leadership Training (SALT) has experienced a wonderful year. The SALT Team has worked with numerous congregations, some twice. Mike Vaughn, who joined SALT at the first of the year, has been a great addition to the work, helping congregations with our follow-up sessions "Strategic Planning" and "Making Disciples." These additional workshops have proven fruitful for everyone.

The following are excerpts from letters from two of the churches that worked with SALT and wanted to share their results from the work.

"We have completed our strategic planning with Mike and Lisa Vaughn. It was challenging but rewarding. We only set one goal, but it stood out as something that the majority of our congregation felt we needed. The goal is to grow together as a loving church family. I believe we are already very loving, but what might be missing is vulnerability and intimacy, a certain closeness.

Several people stood up and took responsibility for the overall goal and various, specific aspects of reaching the goal. The real success I see in all of it is this: those who stepped up have very much in the way of experience, knowledge, ability, and common sense to offer, but for one reason or another, have not been engaged in using it on behalf of the church. You might say the strategic planning brought them out of the 'shadows' and into the fray.

Since you were here, we have immersed a new brother into Christ, and are having weekly Bible studies with him which will likely last a year or more. He is a great asset, very familiar with Scripture yet, absent of all the denominational dogma, a self-studier."

"Since the initial announcement and introduction to the entire congregation, the following has taken place...

- Most all members signed up to be involved in at least one activity
- Multiple meetings have taken place around all the activities
- A 5 step Guest/Visitor Experience Team (VET) program



has been implemented and is going strong.

- Kids Kingdom program kicked off in mid-April (after Lads2Leaders was completed) and has been a success.
- Multiple absent families have begun to visit again, based on the work of the Absent Family "Reachout" team.
- The willing to serve sheets were revamped and updated, passed out and completed by all members. This effort has helped more people be involved and allowed committee and team leaders to know who a good person to complete tasks or activities might be.
- Our Friends and Family (community outreach) Parenting Seminar has been set for late October.



- Many lessons and thoughts from the pulpit have focused on our Vision/Mission and our elders state the vision very
 often in closing/opening remarks.
- Since the initial congregational announcement, we have had at least 25 new members place membership...These don't all represent young families, but it does represent at least 2 young families with children.
- There are many other ancillary activities that have been established or taken place since our initial workshop, but they are too numerous to mention here.

Along with these activities, I have seen the congregation's mind-set and focus change in the following ways...

- Members and leaders alike are much more focused on how our community perceives us and less worried about how others outside 'churched people' perceive us.
- Members and leaders now put a higher priority on 'non-churched' guests and visitors, which has enabled changes to be more readily accepted and approved. It has also changed the direction and content of lessons, announcements from the pulpit and the way we use social media and our website to our strategic advantage.
- Our visitors, whether they be churched or not, now quickly notice that we have a strategy and plan in place to welcome and love on them, and they are impressed.
- Our members now feel they have more of a purpose and can see how their actions and activities produce results. They now have more hope for the future based on their understanding of the communicated strategy and direction.

The workshops that Bob and Mike conducted through Sunset's SALT program have radically changed the strategic direction of our congregation. The vision & mission along with the goals & activities they helped us craft and create, have helped us change our outlook of inward complacency to one of outward activity, focus, direction and vision. I would highly recommend these SALT workshops to any congregation looking to truly fulfill Christ's mission for the church (Matt 28) but need help driving the motivation and direction necessary for success.



These workshops are not 'cookie cutter' but are tailored to fit each congregation's specific challenges and traditions so that they can ultimately reach the unique communities in which they reside."


